STEP FIVE INTO ACTION

Admitted to ourselves, to God, and to another human being the exact nature (col 4) of our wrongs(col 3).

This is how Bill summarized the group's origin and early growth:

"The Oxford Group was a **nondenominational evangelical movement**, streamlined for the modern world and then at the height of its very considerable success. It had been founded ten or a dozen years earlier by a Luthern minister, **Dr. Frank Buchman**. Among his first converts had been **Dr. Sam Shoemaker** and another clergyman **Sherry Day.** They would deal in simple common denominators of all religions which would be potent enough to change the lives of men and women. They had hoped to set up a chain reaction -- one person carrying the good news to the next. their aim was world conversion. Everybody, as they put it, needed changing. They had their first effort upon the **Princeton campus** among students.

"Agreeing with **James** in the New Testament, they thought people ought to confess their sins' one to another.' Heavily emphasizing this wholesale sort of personal housecleaning, they called the process 'sharing.' Not only were things to be confessed, something was to be done about them. This usually took the form of what they called restitution, the restoration of good personal relationships by making amends for harms done.

.....(Steps 5,6,7,8,9)

"they were most ardent, too, in their practice of meditation and prayer, at least one hour per day, and two hours would be better. They felt that when people commenced to adhere to these high moral standards, then God could enter and direct their lives.[BB pg 25] Under these conditions, every individual could receive specific guidance, which could inspire every decision and act of living, great or small. Following meditation and prayer, they practiced what they called a quiet time, asking God [for] specific directives. Pencil in hand, they wrote down what came into their minds; one could do this alone, with his family, or in the company of a likeminded group which was called a 'team'. Such a way of life was urged upon all comers. It was a very dynamic and sometimes a very aggressive evangelism."

Heavenly Father,

BB pg 72 p 2 >This brings us to the **Fifth Step** in the program of recovery mentioned in the preceding chapter.

This is perhaps difficult - especially discussing our defects with another person. We think we have done well enough in admitting these things to ourselves. There is doubt about that. In actual practice, we usually find a solitary self-appraisal insufficient. Many of us thought it necessary to go much further. We will be more reconciled to discussing ourselves with another person when we see good reasons why we should do so.

The best reason first: If we skip this vital step, we may not overcome drinking.

....until they told someone else ALL their life story. (resentments, fears, harmful conduct.)

- 1. we are delighted.
- 2. We can look the world in the eye.

- 7. Often feel drink problem has disappeared.
- 8. Feel we are on the Broad Highway.
- Walk hand in hand with the Spirit of the Universe.
- 9. Be quiet for an hour.
- 10. Know God better.

STEP SIX GET READY for POWER

Were entirely ready to HAVE GOD remove ALL these defects of character.

Taking this book down from our shelf we turn to the page which contains the twelve steps. Carefully reading the first five proposals we ask if we have omitted anything, for we are building an arch through which we shall walk a free man at last. Is our work solid so far? Are the stones properly in place? Have we skimped on the cement put into the foundation? Have we tried to make mortar without sand?

Steps 4 & 5 (what we need to CHANGE) Steps 6 & 7 (where the CHANGE takes place) Steps 8 & 9 (experience the results of that CHANGE) Shortest steps in the Big Book narrative (6 & 7) are the most powerful. (WHERE THE MIRACLE TAKES PLACE)

BB pg 76 > We have **emphasized** <u>willingness</u> as being indispensable. Are we now ready to let God remove from us ALL <u>the things</u> <u>we have admitted ARE OBJECTIONABLE?</u>

If we still cling to something we will not let go, we ask God to help us be willing.

Lord God, I thank you from the bottom of my heart that I know you better. I am now ready to let you remove from me ALL the things that are objectionable. I ask You, Lord, to help me be willing to let go of any shortcomings I may still cling to. AMEN

Pretty good, huh? we had no humility, no sense of having received anything through the grace of our Heavenly Father.

"I don't believe I have any right to get cocky about getting sober," he said, "It's only through God's grace that I did it. I can feel very thankful that I was privileged to do it... If my strength does come from Him, who am I to get cocky about it?"

Dr. Bob pg 179 >Among the earliest of the pioneers to go home from Akron was Earl T. of Chicago. Recalling the afternoon he spent with Dr. bob in his office, earl said, "He very carefully helped me through my moral inventory, suggested many, many bad bad personality traits (column 3) and character defects(column 4). When this was finished, he asked me if I would like to have these defects removed.

"Without much thought, I said, 'Yes, I would.' And then he asked me to get down on my knees at the desk with him, and we both prayed audibly to have these defects of character removed."

The "four absolutes", <u>absolute honesty,</u> <u>absolute unselfishness,</u> <u>absolute purity,</u> <u>and absolute love.</u>
